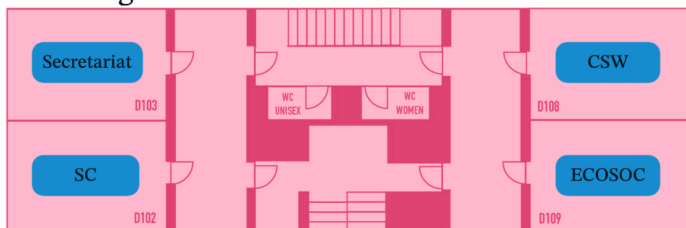

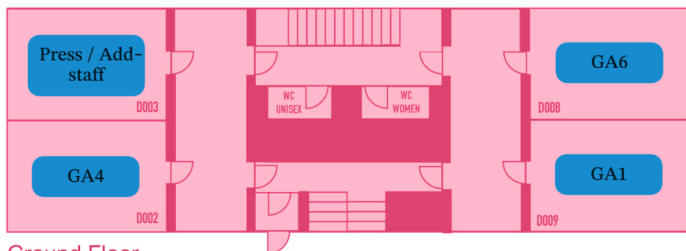

Conference Manager: The conference manager organizes the conference and is responsible for administrative tasks.

Secretary General: The secretary general is the highest authority of the conference.
